**Ripple Effect: Biomimicry & Nature's Genius**

Although nature works to solve many of the same issues that people do - finding food, staying warm or cool, creating shelter - organisms do this in a way that is entirely sustainable. This interactive session will introduce the concept of biomimicry through current examples of leading-edge products and processes, walking participants through a sustainability framework called "Life's Principles" and a current Pacific Northwest project called the Urban Greenprint. Participants will engage in three hands-on sessions to connect with concepts on a personal level and understand how to apply biomimicry to real world issues.
